## Admissions Policy

This policy will be used to determine admissions to our nursery and all admissions decisions will be justified by reference to the criteria given.

The School Governors are responsible for Admission to our Nursery which currently has capacity for 39 full time equivalent places. Children will attend nursery for either three or five terms prior to their entry into school. If their birthday falls between 1<sup>st</sup> April and 31<sup>st</sup> August they will be admitted at the beginning of the autumn term following their third birthday and will attend for three terms. Once places have been allocated in September, further admissions may be made at the beginning of the spring term if places are available. The January places will be allocated to children whose birthday falls between 1<sup>st</sup> September and 31<sup>st</sup> December and they will attend for five terms. There will not be an April intake.

Children will attend for either 15 hours per week (with an option to top up some afternoons at a chargeable rate) or 30 hours per week term time only adhering to three different attendance patterns: Monday to Friday mornings only, Monday to Friday full days, Monday to Friday additional afternoons by a half termly top up system.

The head teacher will keep an application list of pupils seeking admission; children can be added to this list from birth. However, inclusion of a child's name on the list does not constitute a promise of a place. Places are not allocated on a 'first come, first served' basis. Allocation of September places will be made in April and January places in November. Parents are invited to complete a data application form the term before commencement.

Where there are more applications than available places, the following

criteria will be used to decide which children are offered a place:

When Nursery is oversubscribed, after the admission of pupils with Education Health Care Plans where the school is named in the Plan, priority for admissions will be given to those children who are deemed to be 'looked after' or who have previously been 'looked after'.

The priority order for considering the remaining applications is as follows:

1. Pupils living within the catchment area of the school, and those who can provide firm evidence that they will be living in the catchment area by the appropriate admission date.
2. Pupils with siblings already in the school and who are expected to be on roll at the school at the time of admission who live within the greater catchment area of the Morpeth school partnership.
3. Pupils living within the greater catchment area of the Morpeth school partnership and those on whose behalf firm evidence is presented that they will be living in the catchment area by the appropriate admission date.
4. Pupils who have a sibling who already attends the school living outside of the greater catchment area.
5. Pupils on whose behalf preferences are expressed on grounds other than those outlined.

School will write to parents of children to be offered places as soon as possible after the date of allocation confirming the offer of a Nursery place, and detailing the attendance option available in the provision. If demand is very high, applicants may be unsuccessful and they will be informed of this at this time. They will then have the option of being placed on a waiting list.

Parents are given two weeks to accept the offer of a place. After this

time, if no acceptance is received or the offer is declined, the place will become vacant and it will be offered to the next child in priority order. This process will continue until all places are full or all children on the 'waiting list' have been offered places.

If there are fewer applications by the allocation date than places available, we will continue to offer places to new applicants as they are received, until Nursery is full.

We appreciate that parents may be disappointed that they have not been allocated a place in the attendance pattern of their preference. However we encourage parents to stick with the session they have been allocated so their child forms relationships with other children in the session and builds a routine.

Admission to a reception class will be in accordance with Northumberland County Council's Admissions Policy and admission to our nursery does not constitute any right of entry to reception at Morpeth First School.
