School staggered start and finish times

The leadership team have reviewed the start and finish times for the children in each year group and have decided to keep it as it is for the foreseeable future. In the event of heavy rain or extreme weather, the doors to all classes will open from 8.40am so parents can drop the children straight in when they arrive.

We are aware that the car park is small, and having the staggered times does help reduce congestion and anxiety around finding somewhere safe to park. Our Key Stage 2 cloakroom areas are also very small, and we only have sufficient space for one class at a time to come in safely. 60 children from either Year 3 or Year 4, all entering a small space at once, would create unnecessary risk indoors, so this remains the safest option for everyone.

Polite requests

If your child is going to be absent from school due to illness, please either ring and leave a message on the school answer machine, or email admin@morpethfirst.northumberland.sch.uk. Please don't send a message to your child's teacher on See-Saw about it, as they may not check them until later in the day, by which time the registers have been done.

If your child needs to attend a medical appointment during the school day, we need to see proof of the appointment in order to authorise the absence. This can be an appointment card, hospital letter, etc.

If you wish to request leave for your child, then a form needs to be collected from the school office or it can be emailed out to you, and completed. We report our school attendance to the Education Welfare Officer, and we need to have any requests made in writing. Thank you.

After the last 2 years of very little fundraising able to happen due to Covid, we are looking to raise funds for our Forest School and outdoor learning spaces, and this will be the first fundraiser to do that.
