<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Andy Goldsworthy was born 26 July 1956. ● He is a British sculptor, photographer and environmentalist ● Produces site-specific sculptures and land art situated in natural and urban settings. ● The materials used often include brightly coloured flowers, leaves, mud, pinecones, snow, stone, twigs and thorns.
